



The Office of Undergraduate Admission reserves the right to rescind an offer of admission at any point up to the start of classes.

Reasons for rescission of an admission offer include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Failure to graduate and receive a diploma by the end of the school year
- A significant decline in academic performance in the applicant's final months of school
- Conduct related issues including criminal matters and disciplinary action taken by an educational institution including but not limited to suspension and expulsion
- Use of incomplete, falsified, altered, or embellished information in the application
- Engagement in conduct posing an unreasonable risk to the safety or security of the UVA community
- Engagement in behavior that negatively reflects on a student's integrity, character or fitness for study and/or participation in the University community prior to enrollment

Upon learning of any relevant significant changes to a student's record that would merit review, the Dean of Admissions will convene a committee for review. The committee will consist of the Dean of Admissions and a senior member of the admissions staff. Depending on the nature of the allegations forming the basis for review, the committee will include a representative from the Office of the Dean of Students (ODOS), Office of Equal Opportunity and Civil Rights (EOCR), and respective school units, among others. The student shall have an opportunity to provide a written statement to the committee for consideration. The committee can also gather and consider additional relevant information from various sources to include the high school counselor, a teacher, Principal and other relevant individuals. The committee may also request an in-person or virtual meeting between the committee and the student to gather more information.

The committee will then decide as to whether the offer of admission should be rescinded, or any other conditions should be placed on the student prior to enrollment. Among the factors considered when evaluating the rescission are:

- The context, nature and gravity of the conduct;
- The time that has passed since the occurrence of any conduct;
- The age of the applicant at the time of the conduct;
- The severity of type of alleged violation or misconduct; and
- Any evidence of sincerity, rehabilitation or good conduct produced by the applicant.

The Dean of Admissions shall notify the student the committee's determination to the student via e-mail and update the student's application file reflecting the committee's decision. The review process will be completed within a reasonable period of time and may generally take 2-4 weeks following the committee receiving all necessary information to start its review. This timeline may be extended based on extenuating circumstances.
